I've been looking at the March edition from last year. We'd just conducted a sausage sizzle at Bunnings, done some work on the International Charter process, and then WHAM, our activities were brought to a screeching halt by Covid-19. And what an extraordinary year we've had!

27 March will mark the first anniversary of the death of our beautiful Tim Warwarek, and then on 1 April he was followed by our founding community leader Peter Ryan.

Peter sent me an Ash Wednesday poem last year, and I'm using it again. Because of Covid safe-



guards, the traditional "smudge" of ashes on the forehead was this year replaced by sprinkling of ashes on the head.

Last year we had to cancel the traditional Passover Meal and Footwashing ceremony which is celebrated by all L'Arche communities during Holy Week, the week between Palm Sunday and Easter. We are planning to have a ceremony this year, although the format will have to be adapted somewhat. It is always a life-giving occasion and we hope to be able to capture that.

Lots of fun stuff happening this month – it would be great if you can join us for any or all of the events.






A surprise from France!

To share our Christmas joy and friendship, the l'Arche Lille community (located in the North of France) is pleased to send you this mosaic. It was made in our workshops with great care




Belgium has had a tough time during the Covid pandemic*, so it was a cause for celebration when our friends recently received their vaccinations.


