What does Community mean to you?



When, in L'Arche, we hear the word 'community' what images immediately spring to mind? There are many answers that can be given to that question and all of them may say something helpful about what it means to be part of a L'Arche community.

It was this question that was put to a pottery-making group at a L'Arche Adelaide Community Weekend a few years ago. People moulded out of clay what community meant to them. There were images of people, young and old; praying hands; words of faith etched into clay; people in a boat (as in the L'Arche logo); images of hospitality, such as bread and a cup; friendship depicted by a circle of friends; a cross.

Also, when we think of community we may readily think of a house, perhaps the Dinwoodie house, which we plan to occupy soon, with people with and without intellectual disability living together. Much attention lately has concerned house preparation and the community life that will happen there. So we link a house to community, and understandably so.

A recent L'Arche National Community & Spiritual Life Forum invited us to consider the telling and sharing of stories as key to community, i.e. God's story; the L'Arche International story, the L'Arche Adelaide story, not to mention our personal story filled as it is with joy and sorrow.

At present our story is tinged with much sadness over the sudden recent death of our dear friend Harry. And as we listen to such a story we respond with compassion, open arms, and the love of God, and in doing so we strengthen the bonds that join us ... in community.

Recent News - Community House Preparations

- Lara, our Community Development Coordinator has been working on our NDIS registration. We received a very positive auditor's report during Stage 2 of our Audit and are now awaiting final approval as a registered NDIS provider. Thanks, Lara for all your hard work!
- L'Arche Adelaide has started a discernment process that will lead to the appointment of our first Community Leader, a very important role which includes the management of our house.
- The first step was to draft the L'Arche Adelaide Community Mandate, a strategic plan that will guide the work of our Community Leader and our community for the next four years. The Community Mandate 2021-2025 has been completed and endorsed by the Board.
- The Discernment Team (Claire Lawler, L'Arche Australia; Trevor Whitney, Chairperson of the Board; Shelley Cochrane, Spiritual Life Coordinator; and Bev Corner, Community member) are now concentrating on appointing our first Community Leader.
- With the loss of our dearly loved Harry, who had been selected to accompany Mark in our community house, we are now looking for a suitable replacement to join Mark in the house.
- We ask for your prayerful support for those who are working on house preparations; for those including Mark Tanner who will be moving into the house; and for their families.

Finance Update

- The net cash position of L'Arche Adelaide on 21 September 2021 was \$44,822. THANK YOU for your donations over the last 4 months!
- Mel has emailed all donors with their tax deduction receipts for the year ended 30 June 2021. Please advise Mel if you have not received your receipt
- We have made a payment of \$2281 for Stage 2 of the NDIS audit and the application for our registration has been lodged with NDIS awaiting approval.
- We're applying to lease the rectory at St Francis of Assisi Parish for our planned house.
- We've started preparing a budget for the first 12 months of the operation of the house.
- We are aiming to have net assets of \$60,000 by December 2021 when we are expected to commence our community house for people with disabilities.
- This would assist us to have sufficient working capital to set up the house & provide some buffer for unexpected expenditures or a drop in rental income.
